FROM REV. NANCY' S DESK

Marcia McFee says that when she was a senior in high school "Urban Cowboy" came out and everyone started singing along with Johnny Lee, "lookin' for love in all the wrong places, looking for love in too many faces..." Well, as the saying goes, "story of my life!" But isn't it the story of most of our lives, whether or not we've had hiccups with our relationships over the years? We've looked for "love"–for meaning, purpose, satisfaction, security (however you describe it) in so many things that actually haven't given us the depth of "what we're dreaming of," so says the song.

Lent is traditionally a time to revisit our priorities. I hope this worship series will give us a lens through which to do just that. Our weekly worship scriptures mention "love" and "heart" over and over. And so I went searching for what our faith narrative was saying about true love. Each week offers us a model of love based on the stories of Jesus' life and ministry, death and resurrection. And each week we consider the opposites that show up, often valued in our culture, in those things that are distracting us: fame, money, control, possessions, power, certainty, unhealthy relationships, or addictions. When we look to these things for the love we crave, we are sorely disappointed. And yet, as another song goes, "what the world needs now is love."


I hope you will find something to make this holy season meaningful for you. Some value the tradition of giving something up as a way of refocusing on God and what matters most to us. But perhaps it will be the Thursday morning meditation with Rev. Eva, or using the devotional journal we're providing, or taking some intentional time for prayer that will strengthen your connection with God. Lent is also a good time to revisit the Star Word you received at Epiphany (there are more in the office if you need one): how is that word speaking to you and guiding you this year?

DEVOTIONAL JOURNAL

As a spiritual practice during Lent, we have available to you a Devotional Journal to pick up starting Ash Wednesday and throughout the season. You will find an introduction to the worship series we are using, book and music suggestions for adults and teens, as well as weekly questions and scripture for personal reflection. The scriptures and questions supplement each week of our Sunday worship themes.





GUIDED MEDITATION

Rev Eva welcomes all who might have an interest in guided meditation. This practice is shaped by listening quietly to another person's voice and to see in their minds eye the scene that is presented to the group. Meditation is an ancient tradition and as we are aware, our mind will wander when confronted with silence, and therefore many find it easier to focus and relax when listening to a story of sorts. During Lent Eva will present a guided meditation on Thursday mornings at 8:30 AM. These meditations will correspond with the previous Sunday Lenten Scripture reading.

You are not expected to be dressed, had breakfast or drive to the church, rather when you register for the zoom link, you will have access to the zoom meditation. You will be invited to have both your camera and sound off so there are no distractions for anyone during this 30 minutes. After the reading there will be a time of silence to reflect on what has been said and how you received it. After the silence those who may wish to talk about the experience will be invited to engage their sound and also their camera if they wish. All are welcome!



HEALING PATHWAYS





TRAVEL TO GUATEMALA THIS SUMMER

Travel with an all ages group from Northminster and St David's United Churches to connect with one another, with spirituality, and with the people of this beautiful country. For elders, families, teens, grandparents, singles, all are welcome to come! You are about to embark on a journey to an incredible country, a mystical land full of beauty and struggle. You'll discover the Highlands of Guatemala, at 5000 feet elevation and above, where the climate will be temperate, sub-tropical areas around the lake, and mountainous regions around Quezaltenango. We'll meet inspiring people, visiting Guatemalans in their homes, and learn how culture is lived out and formed with family as the centre. You'll learn about Mayan culture, traditions and spirituality. You'll see beautiful places in nature: a nature reserve, an organic farm, rolling green hills growing corn, beans and squash. We'll spend a day with the children at the school in a small mountain Mayan community. You'll visit with weavers watching their ancient techniques form tapestries, and see the wonder of the colour in the markets. Visit an ancient Mayan City Site, drink coffee or hot chocolate under a volcano, wander the market in Chichicastenango, and soak in a volcanic hot spring. You'll meet inspiring people and visit projects working to better Guatemalan Society and address basic human needs.
